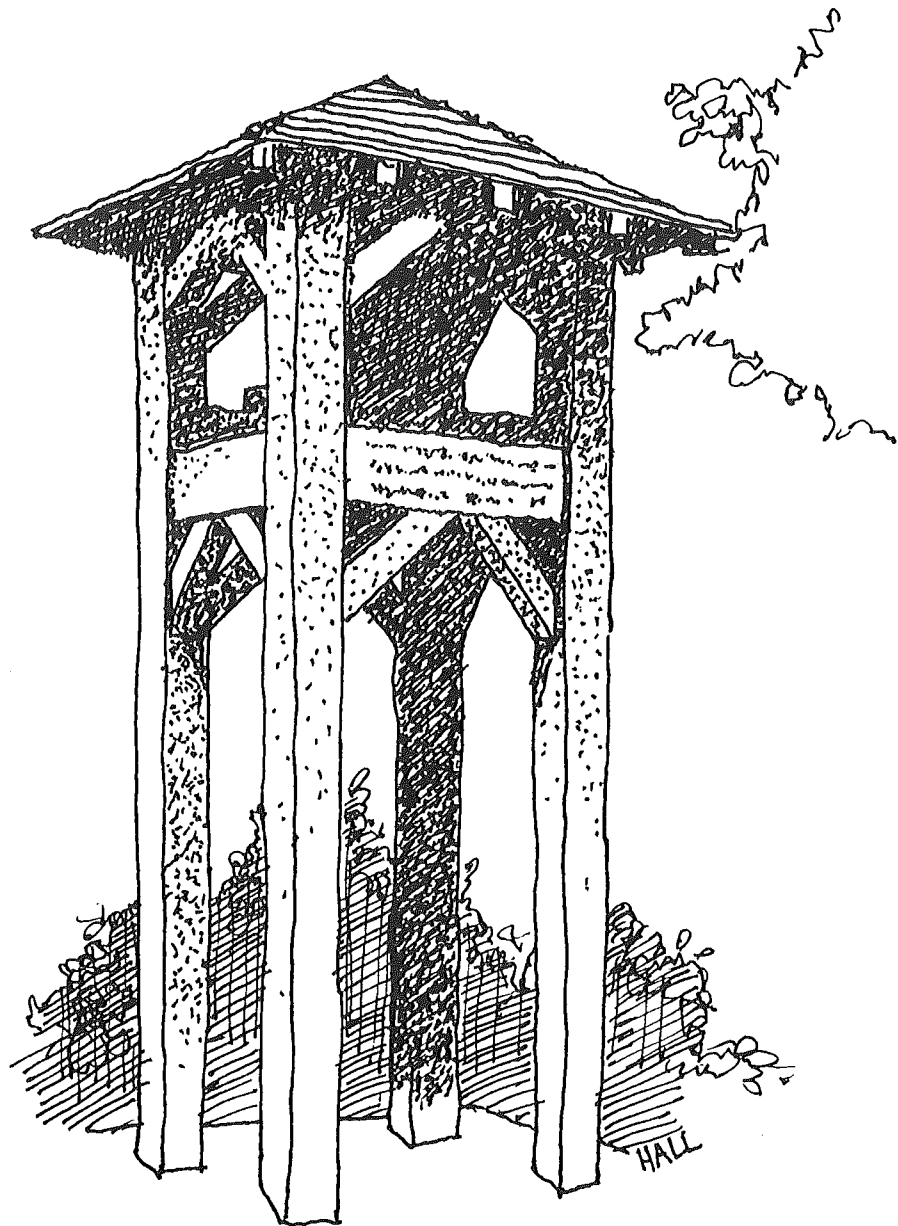

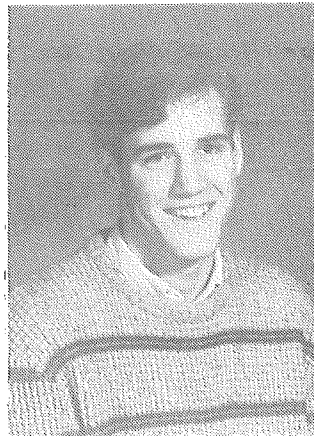

THE YAWGOOG ALUMNI ASSOCIATION & THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

The Narragansett Council has commenced a capital campaign to raise \$6,000,000 for its many properties. The last time the Council held a capital campaign was 1961, 32 years ago. Yawgoog will receive \$2,600,000 of capital improvements from the money raised. The Yawgoog Alumni Association has pledged \$100,000, which places the group in the 'Pacesetter' category, the top giving level in the campaign. The Alumni Association's pledge will be used to rebuild the Three Point, Medicine Bow and Sandy Beach waterfront cabins. The Executive Committee has been hard at work since last April planning and organizing this large undertaking. Three subcommittees have been formed to divide up the work: Fundraising, chaired by Chuck DeBevoise; Membership, chaired by Ray Lamore; and Building and Planning, chaired by Mike Schwab.

The Fundraising Subcommittee has completed two significant tasks. A case statement describing in overall terms the Council's campaign was delivered to you either at the Reunion last August or in the mail during September. The Alumni Association's solicitation of your pledge was mailed to you in late October and you may have been called as part of our phonathon conducted on November 3rd. Hopefully, you have responded by now and if so, we thank you for your gift. The Executive Committee, which consists of 20 members, had pledged a total of \$20,450 to the campaign. We hope our example will inspire all Yawgoog Alumni to generously support this important campaign.

A key component to achieving the Alumni Association's goal of raising \$100,000 is to expand the current membership base. During the past several years, the number of dues-paying alumni has decreased. Recognizing this fact, the Executive Committee has decided to launch a 'Membership Drive'. We need your help!!! If you know anyone who is a former Yawgoog camper, please let us know. Enclosed in this newsletter is a Membership Drive Form. Please complete it and mail it to us. We will forward Alumni Association introductory letters and membership applications to the people you have listed on the form. Hopefully, they will realize that our Alumni Association is a dynamic organization that is committed to Yawgoog Scout Reservation. Thank you for your assistance!!!

The Building and Planning Subcommittee met with the Ranger Staff at Camp a few weeks ago to discuss the new waterfront cabins and take measurements. These three important program centers are now being redesigned to accommodate new programs and increased staffing needs. The buildings will maintain the same rustic style now at Camp. We plan to start in the fall of 1994 with the Medicine Bow waterfront and have the new facility open for the summer of 1995. The new facility will include almost doubling the size of the existing beach to ease crowding in the boating area.

JOSEPH J. HERBOLD

This is a long, overdue salute to Joe Herbold, who is serving his 8th year as Chairman of the Yawgoog Alumni Association. Joe and the super-active Executive Committee have tackled innumerable projects for the Camp. If we could count the hours spent by this group, under Joe's leadership, it would be an unbelievable figure.

Joe's Scouting background reads almost like a planned progressive chart. Joined Troop 22 Providence in 1960 and served in leadership capacities as follows: Scribe; APL; PL; SPL; JASM; ASM. In 1963 he joined Post 22 and served as Treasurer and President. In Scout ranks, he went from Tenderfoot to Eagle Scout two palms. 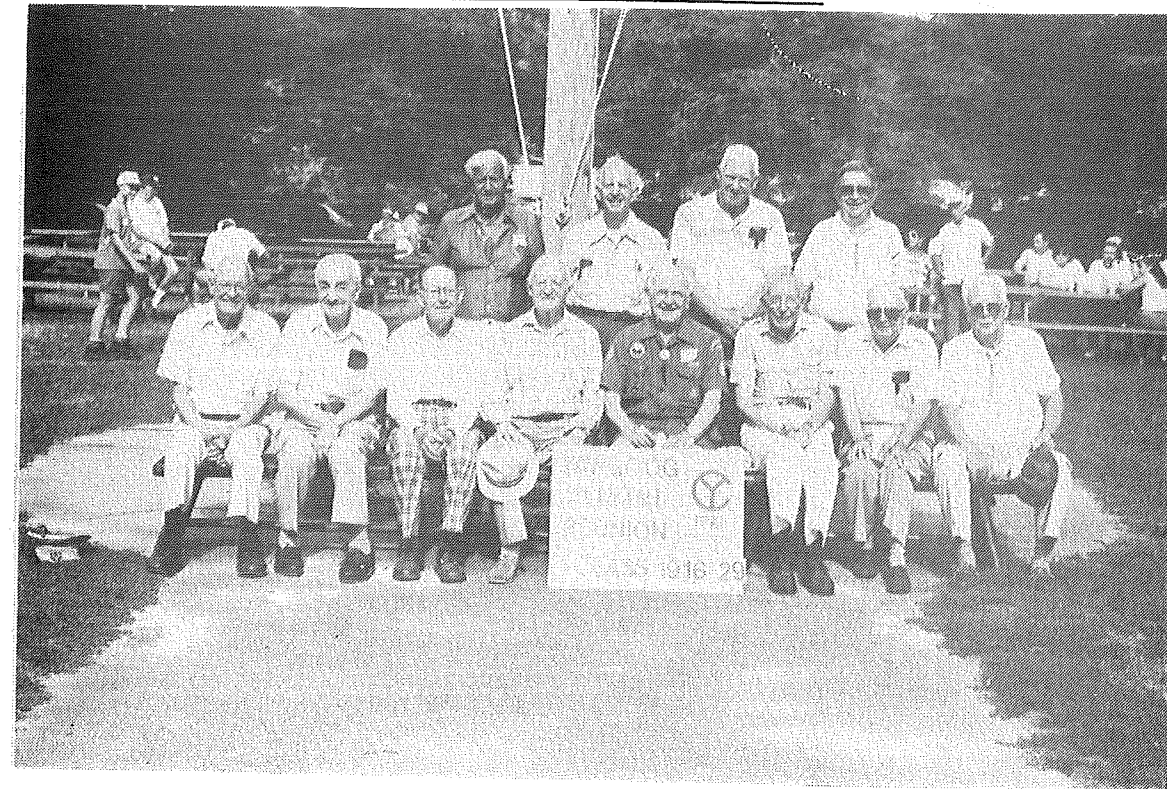

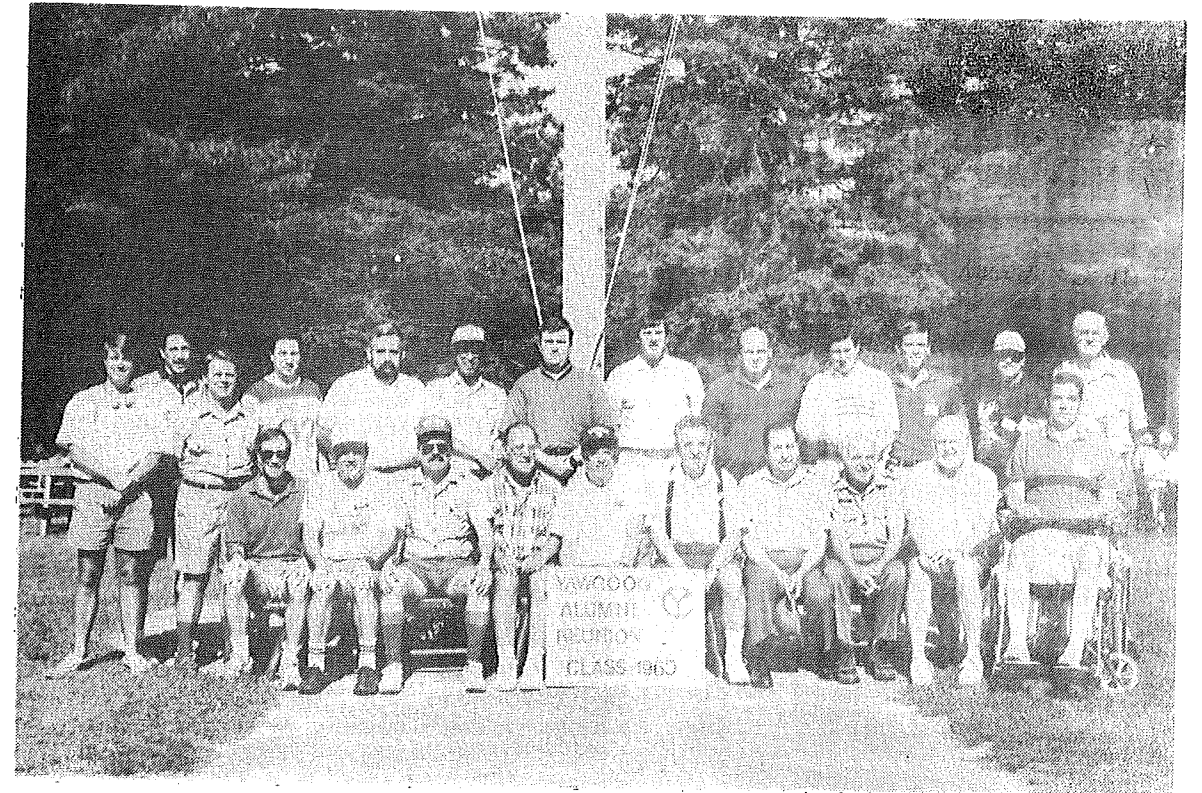

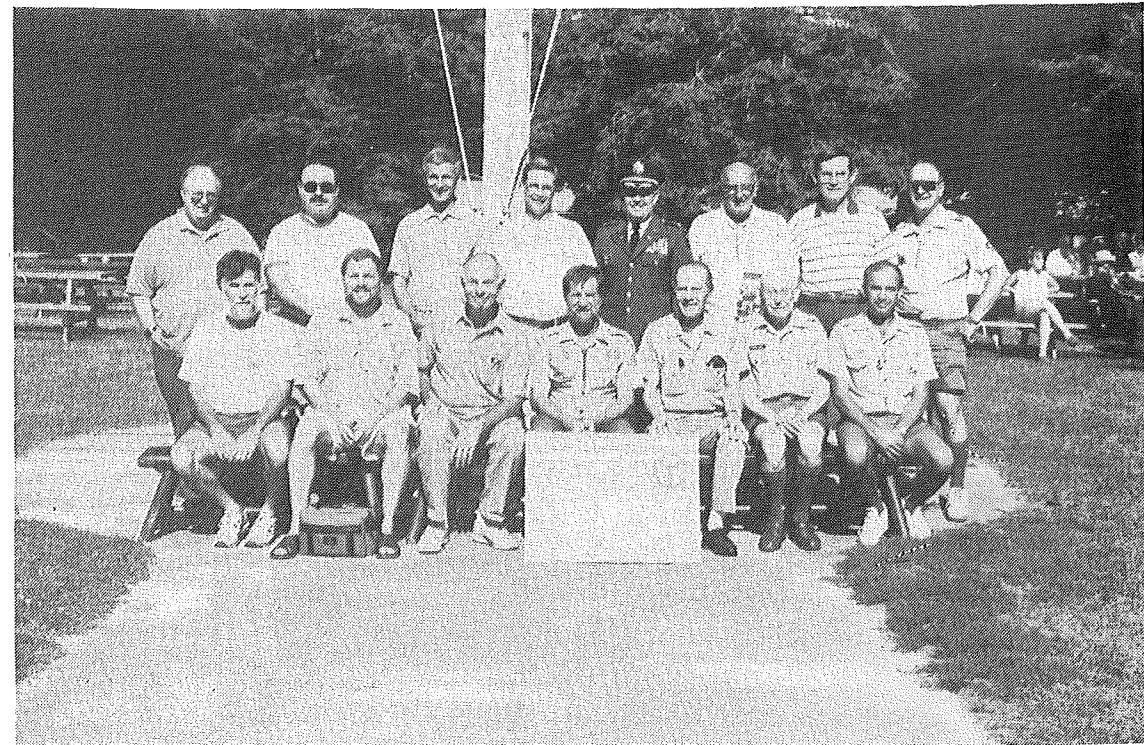

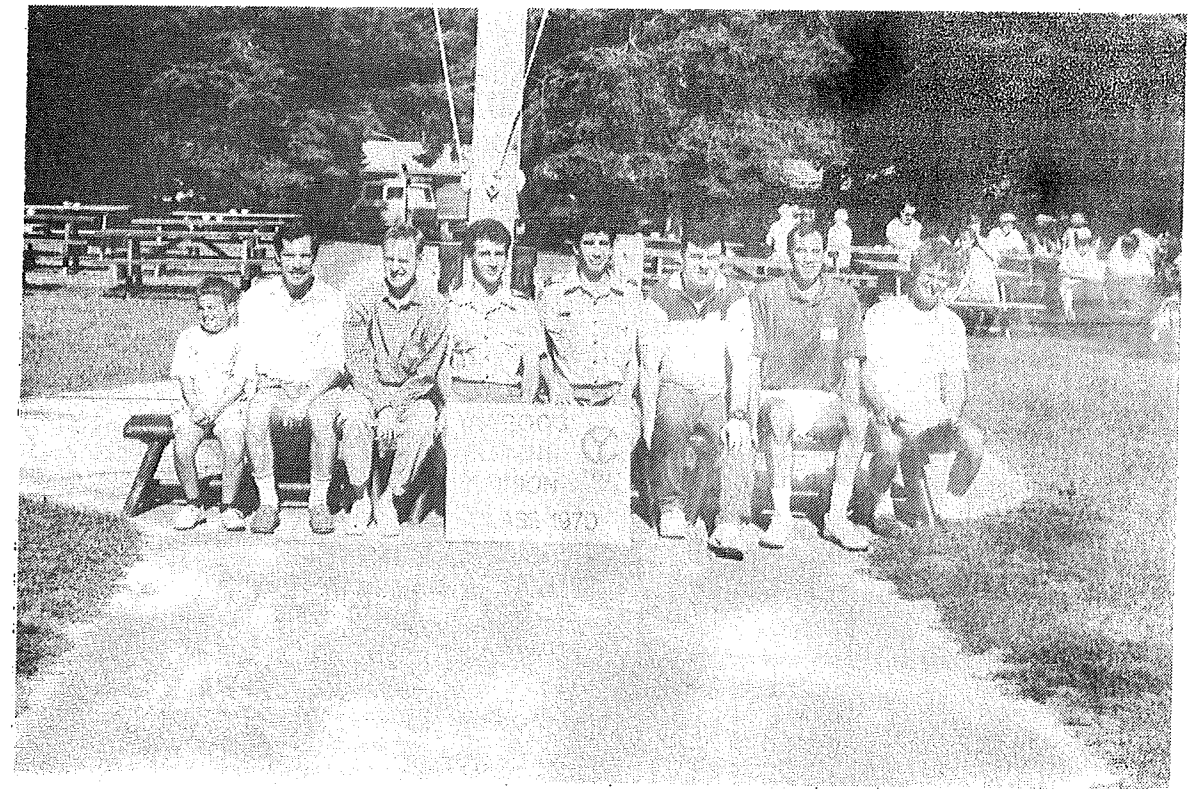
