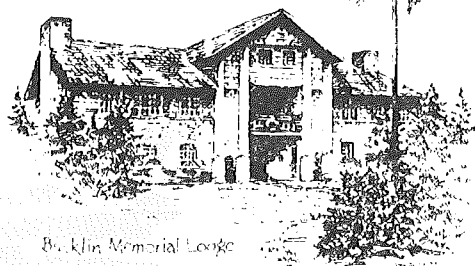

## "GUS' GOSSIP"

### A TRIBUTE TO DONALD C. DEWING

When we think of Yawgoog, we usually think of the fun, the swimming, the staff, the shows, the general activities, which we all have enjoyed over the years. Yet, how often do we think of our Troop's Scoutmaster who spends at least half of his vacation at camp with his troop?

In 1968, my last year at camp, there were 492 volunteer leaders attending camp that season with their troops. That is an average of 61 per week. Imagine what a financial savings these men give the camp. As a recognition, the camp maintains a reduced fee for troops under their own leadership.

Uncle Brad Field started the "Factors' Club" as a tribute to those volunteers where they could enjoy a little adult comradery and a good cup of coffee. The second year the Scoutmaster came to camp, he was usually made a Knight of Yawgoog and was decorated with the humble potato. At dress parade on Sunday, a rousing applause of thanks was given these volunteers.

A potato, a cup of coffee and a hand clap are pretty weak expressions of gratitude, but I'm sure they all appreciate our limitations and derive their recognition in the enjoyment of service to others.

One of these Scoutmasters is Donald Cushman Dewing of Troop 82 Providence. For 68 years he has been a member of the Boy Scouts of America and a Scoutmaster for 60 of those years. His only absence was for 45 months when he served as a Captain in the Air Transport Command in the Fiji Islands during World War II. During all those years, not only at camp, but all year round, he has unselfishly given of himself to 724 boys who are now better citizens because of his dedication to Scouting.

Don did not limit his Scouting volunteer work to only his troop. He was the Treasurer of Narragansett Council for 30 years and has been Treasurer of Rhode Island Boy Scouts since 1962. He has served on many Council Committees and given leadership to many National Jamboree and World Fair troops.

In 1978, Yawgoog honored Don by naming a Troop Campsite in his honor. The funds for the campsite were raised by members of Troop 82 Providence. Camp Don Dewing stands next to the dam in the Three Point Camp.

Don, in saluting you with thanks and gratitude, the Yawgoog Alumni Association pays tribute to the hundreds of thousands of volunteer man hours you gave as a Scoutmaster to aid the cause of Scouting. (He gave 15,120 volunteer hours of leadership service to Yawgoog and is still going strong!)

## YAWGOOG TODAY

The most important thing about Yawgoog Today is that it is just like the Yawgoog of Yesterday in the most important way: SPIRIT AND TRADITION! The Dress Parades, the Saturday Night Shows, the troop campfires, the "CY" program, the "Totin' Chit", the Yawgoog trails, the natural beauty, the rustic buildings, the deep feelings about Yawgoog--all it means to so many who have camped here through the years--it's still all there. It's still all real! In these important ways, Yawgoog is the same as it was yesterday and, God willing, it will be the same in another hundred years, and how many hundred years after that!

We do have some new programs such as the Challenge Center which features a high ropes course complemented with "low" elements that challenge Scouts to try their skill and courage. (The ZIP line is 70 feet high!) This is a most popular activity and reinforces Scouting's values of physical and mental fitness.

For older Scouts we offer special back-packing trips, portages, black-powder riflery, low impact camping experiences, and sail boarding. Baden-Powell is still our provisional camp, and the Counselor-in-Training Corps begins its 23rd year in 1987. We also conduct an Eagle Candidate Camp for Scouts who are working on their Eagle Scout requirements. The "Eagle Camp" was started in the 60's and is still going strong in the 80's.

The older you get, the more nostalgic you get. That's the way it was "back then" and it's still that way today. Veteran leaders return to Yawgoog--for the Knights of Yawgoog Ceremony or for the gala Alumni Reunion--and they begin to recall those special events and special people that made Yawgoog such a memorable experience for them.

I'm happy to say that we are bulging at the seams most weeks of the season. BUT--the Scouts are not all from the Narragansett Council. In fact, just over 50% of them are from outside our Council. We have more than 85 troops from Long Island alone, another 40 from Connecticut, 20 from Massachusetts, and another 14 from other parts of the U.S. We have become a "regionalized" camp in terms of our population. So--the spirit of Yawgoog is felt and appreciated throughout the region as well as within our own Narragansett Council.

We are keeping up with the times and 1987 will see the "Year of the Computer" at Yawgoog Scout Reservation. This will enhance our efficiency and increase the effectiveness of our services at Yawgoog.

Yawgoog Today! In so many ways it is the Yawgoog of Yesterday! The basic principles of the Scout Oath and Law, the emphasis on outdoor skills, and that great Yawgoog spirit--these live on as the years roll by. The programs keep up with the times, but the emphasis is the same: having lots of fun and learning by doing!

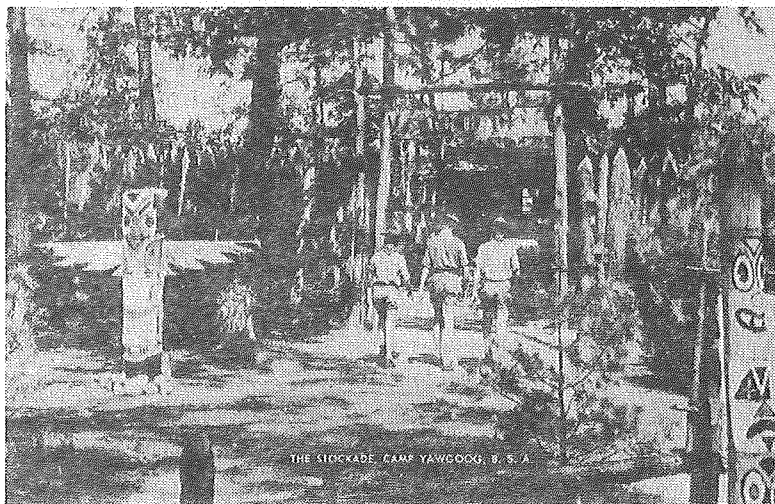

## H. CUSHMAN ANTHONY STOCKADE PROJECT

The H. Cushman Anthony Stockade is the current project undertaken by the Yawgoog Alumni Association. The Stockade Project, which was announced at the Annual Reunion on August 2nd, 1986, is being dedicated to H. Cushman "Gus" Anthony for his life-long dedication and service to Camp Yawgoog.

The present stockade was rebuilt in 1949 and now shows the wear and tear of nearly forty (40) years' use. Replacement of the existing stockade is one of the Camp's greatest physical needs. The H. Cushman Anthony Stockade will consist of a three-sided stockade fence with a two-story blockhouse in each of the front corners. Behind the stockade will be four permanent, open air pavilions where crafts' activities and merit badge work will be done by the Scouts. The front of the new stockade will be seventy (70) feet wide, twenty (20) feet wider than the present stockade. The new stockade will retain the current rustic appearance.

The estimated cost of completing the Stockade Project is \$60,000. The cost for just the stockade fence and blockhouses is estimated at \$35,000. The remaining \$25,000 is for the four (4) pavilions.



As of April 8th, 1987, the Alumni Association had approximately \$27,000 available to spend on the Stockade Project. \$21,374.77 of this amount has been raised from generous donations of 357 members of the Alumni Association. Most individuals have donated \$100 or less, although a few very generous givers have donated \$1,000 or more. \$5,345.64 has been raised from interest earned on the Alumni Association Trust Fund since the Alumni's inception in 1981. \$104.45 has been raised from sales of the "Yawgoog Story".

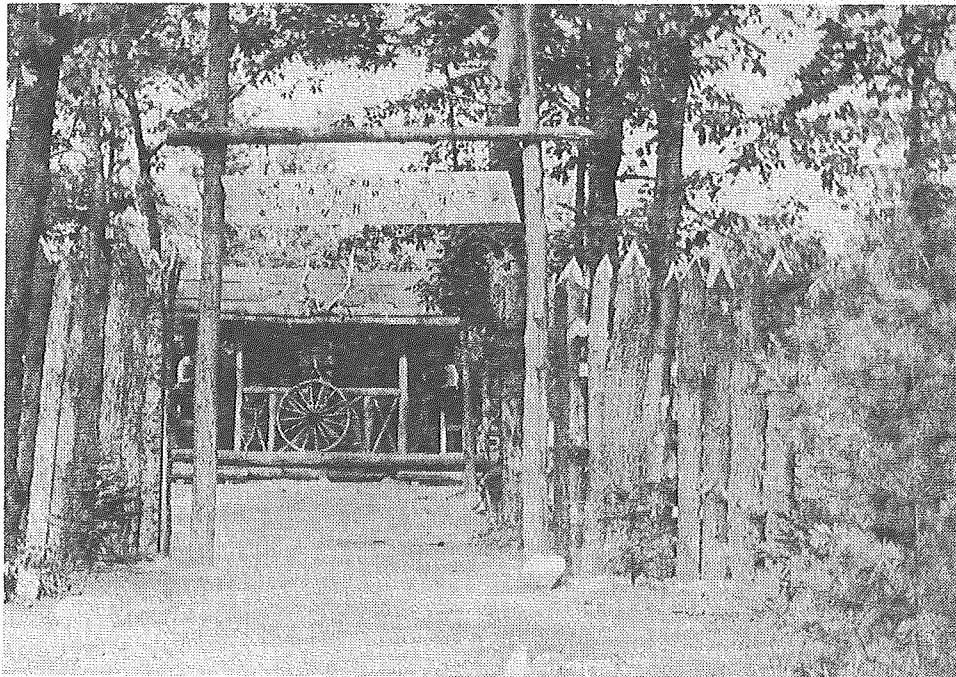
The Stockade Project is the largest and most expensive project ever undertaken by the Alumni Association, requiring for the first time a large fundraising campaign. Alumni Association fundraising efforts have consisted of a special solicitation of members last November, monthly articles in the Narragansett Council's monthly newsletter "The Stalker", solicitations with regular Alumni mailings and some solicitations of non-Scouting charitable sources. Donations continue to be received. Concentrated fundraising efforts will resume next fall.

Linear Corporation of East Providence, Rhode Island, has been retained as the architect for the Stockade Project for a fee of \$2,000. To date, \$1,450 has been paid to the architect. Architectural drawings have been prepared and delivered to the Alumni Association. James B. Hall, an artist and member of the Alumni Association Executive Committee, prepared the renderings of what the

completed Stockade Project will look like. The renderings were displayed at the Reunion last summer. The Stockade Project has received the approval of the Narragansett Council Camping Committee, Executive Committee and Executive Board.

The Stockade Project is presently out to bid. The Alumni Association Stockade Building Subcommittee is discussing the project with various contractors and hopes to obtain a bid within budget in the near future. The Council Finance Committee's approval of the construction contract is the only approval that remains to be obtained when an acceptable contractor bid is received. The target date for completion of the Project is June 1st, 1988. Arrangements must also be made for the demolition of the existing stockade and removal of debris.

The Executive Committee thanks all who have helped the Alumni Association come this far in making the H. Cushman Anthony Stockade Project become a reality and looks forward to the membership's continued support to complete the Project.

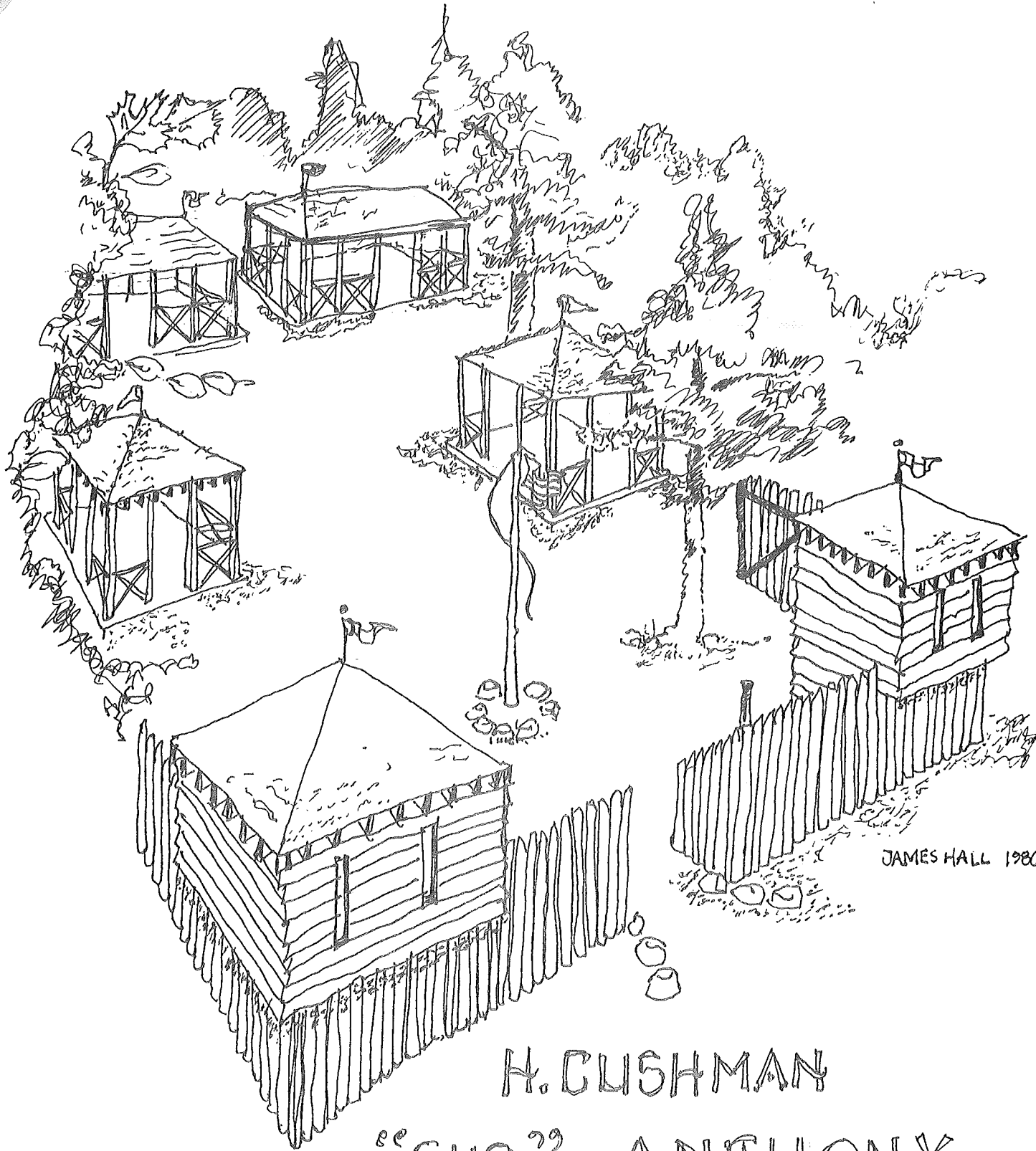

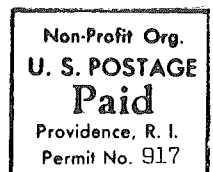
