

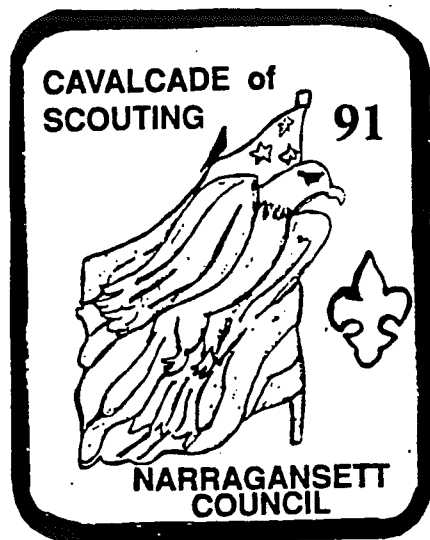
YAWGOOG ALUMNI ASSOCIATION - 1991 PROJECT

As announced at last year's 75th Anniversary Celebration, the Yawgoog Alumni Association has taken on the refurbishment of the Amphitheatre for its 1991 project. This vital reservation center has not had a facelift of this magnitude since the 1960 Golden Jubilee. Although it is still enjoyed by thousands of Scouts and Scouters each week during the summer, some "sprucing up" and improvements were in order.

The Alumni, working closely with the Camp Key Staff and the Rangers, have come up with a list of things to do. Work has already begun on some items and we're happy to report that the block house has a new roof and a new ramp has been added to the stage. The logs for a new and much longer stockade fence have just arrived at Camp and work on that should begin soon.

Other components of this project include improvements to the light and sound systems, new carved wooded signs and plaques, re-painting the Totem Poles, and replacing some of the benches. We hope to have all of this completed for the opening of Camp this summer, or as much as time and funding will allow.

We hope to see everyone at this summer's reunion for the "official" unveiling of a new and improved J. Harold Williams Amphitheatre.



The Narragansett Council is sponsoring the "Cavalcade of Scouting" on Saturday, May 11th, 1991. "GUS'S GOSSIP"

WILLIAM A. SANDFORD

It's hard to imagine any one Scouter who can justly claim more varied and accomplished volunteering than does Bill Sandford.....and, he's still going strong at 79!!

In 1925, he joined that famous "First Providence Troop" under that never to be forgotten Scoutmaster John MacPherson. Bill served every troop leadership post from Assistant Patrol Leader of the Flying Eagle Patrol to Junior Assistant Scoutmaster of that great troop.

From 1925 to 1929, he was a Yawgoog Camper and became the Camp's "Campion Woodsman", which led to his becoming a "JO" (Junior Officer) in 1930. After four summers as a Campmaster for 'stop-over' campers, he became the Divisional Director of Three Point Div.

With the big depression of the thirties still being felt by everyone, Bill, after filling many 'stop gap' jobs, graduated from Rhode Island State College (now U.R.I.) with a degree in Civil Engineering. This led to 34 years and 9 months as Project Engineer with the U.S. Rubber Company until they closed down their Providence Plant.

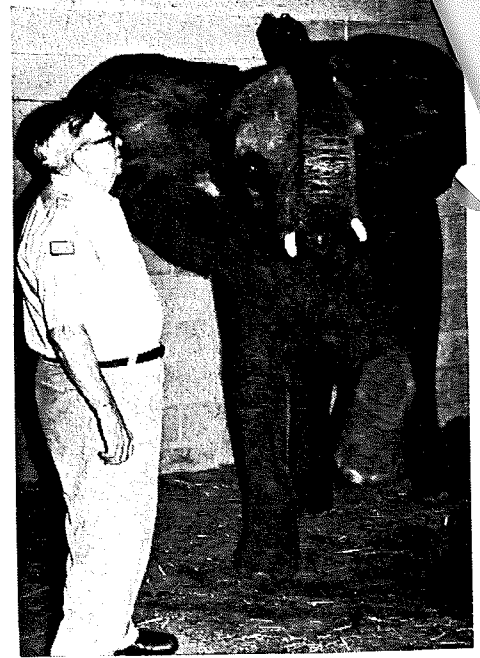
Ever since July of 1939, he has, for 51 years, been fortunate that his college sweetheart Lillian Clark has put up with all his days, evenings and weekends that he still devotes to his many hours of community service. Their daughter, Katherine Mae Wilson, gave Bill and Lillian two great (as in wonderful) granddaughters.

Back in 1945 he and his wife attended a PTA Meeting and Bill came home that night as Scoutmaster of Troop 6 Cranston. Ever since then his unending services have included being a District Commissioner, District Chairman, serving on National Jamboree Staff, Chairman of Camping Committee, Chairman of the Activities Committee, helping "Engineer" Council Camporees, Chaired two Council Shows and now serves on the Narragansett Council Advisory Board and the Executive Committee of the Yawgoog Alumni Association.

With all this Scouting work, he still finds time to be extremely busy helping out at the Roger Williams Park Zoo. He serves as a Guide for Visitor Groups, accompanies the Zoomobile and almost any other service that the Zoo, the public or the animals need. He still sings in the Choir of St. David's Episcopal Church (as he says, "not good, but loud"). He has also served five years on the Church Vestry.

Without doubt, his organizing his famous "Over the Hill Gang" of some 12 to 15 retired Cranston Boy Scouts will go down in the Council's History along with 'Slade's Gang'. This Super-Senior-Scouting-Society is at the beck and call of the Council, the Camp Committee and especially the Yawgoog Alumni Association. (This newsletter with its 1800 mailing list is collated, stapled and post office readied by the "Gang". Thanks, Bill!)

In talking with Bill, he kept paying great tribute to all his many Scouting friends over the years that have meant so much to him: Johnny MacPherson, "Chief" Williams, "Inky" Armstrong, "Casy" Richardson, Bill Manchester, Bill Cumerford, "Weasel" Sykes, "Uncle Brad" Field, Al Murray, Bill McLeod, and on and on. Bill, your Eagle Badge, which you earned, and the Silver Beaver, which was awarded to you, are but meager tributes to you for what you have given and are giving as you continue "to help other people at all times". Thanks. We all salute you!!
