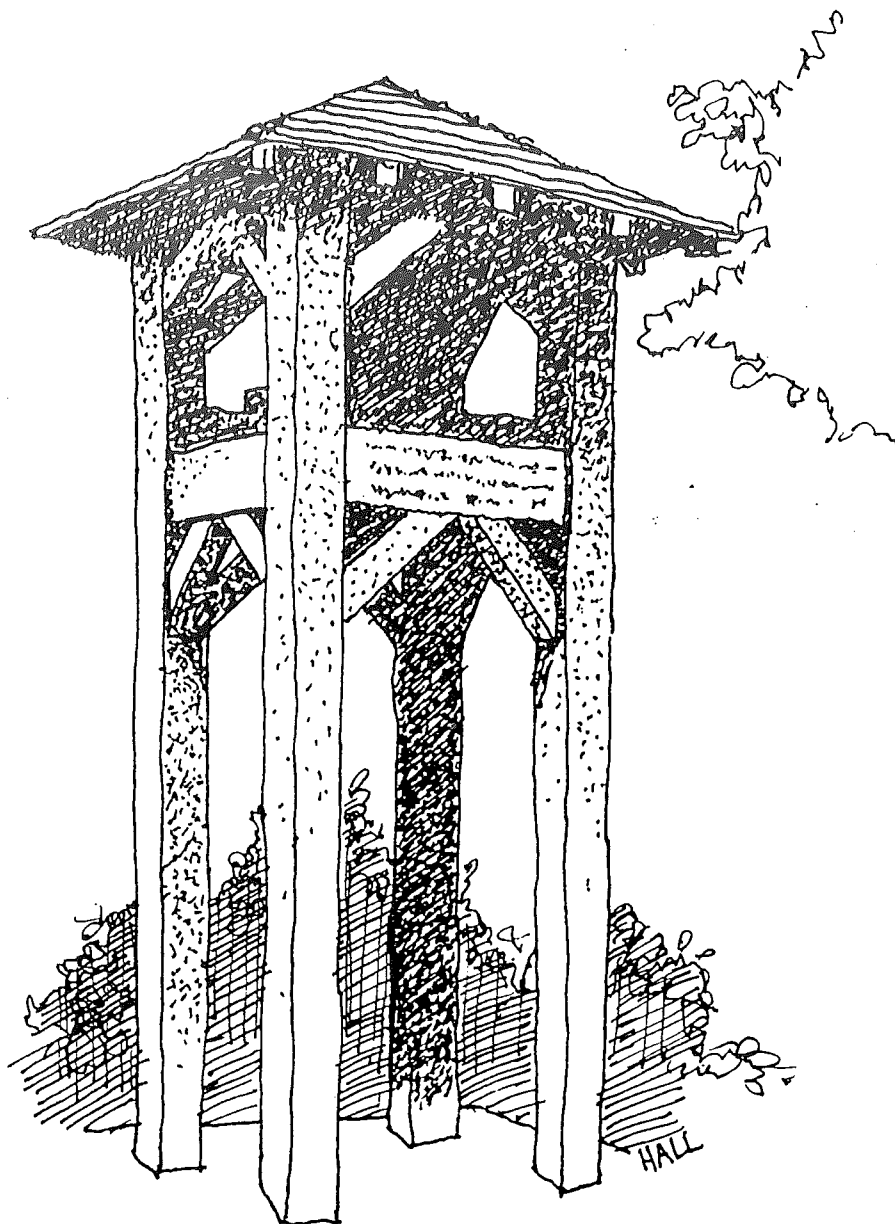

## ALUMNI ASSOCIATION CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

As reported in our 1993 fall newsletter, the Yawgoog Alumni Association pledged to raise \$100,000 as part of the Narragansett Council's Capital Campaign. The money raised by the Alumni Association will be used to rebuild the waterfront cabins at Three Point, Medicine Bow and Sandy Beach.

The Executive Committee has been hard at work since the last newsletter and we are happy to announce we have reached our goal! As of this writing, we have raised slightly over \$100,000 in pledges from 189 Alumni Association members. More significantly the Yawgoog Alumni Association has already collected over \$20,000 of the total pledged amount. The Executive Committee and Council applaud your efforts and generosity. Many thanks to all of you listed on our "Honor Roll of Donors" for your contributions. We would like to add special thanks to the Chairman of our Fundraising Subcommittee, Charles DeBevoise. Members of the subcommittee are: Bruce Ingham, Steve Dolan, Gus Anthony, Peter Berthelette and David Preston. Chuck, a job well done by you and your subcommittee members. A great big 'thank you' to the Narragansett Council Director of Development, Peter Sterrett, and his Administrative Assistant, Kristen Curry, for all their work in assisting the Yawgoog Alumni Association in meeting its goal.

Our job is not over yet though. The bulk of our efforts will now be focused toward the design and building of the three waterfront cabins. Mike Schwab's Building Subcommittee has begun working closely with the Council's Planning Committee to draft up plans for the Medicine Bow Waterfront. Early indications point to a complete facelift of the entire waterfront area at Medicine Bow. New cabin, expansion of the beach and many other exciting ideas are being considered for Medicine Bow. We're told we won't recognize the waterfront when the Building Committee is through.

Although the Alumni's Fundraising Committee has reached their goal, we urge those of you who have not yet pledged towards the campaign to consider pledging. All money collected will be put towards the refurbishment of the three waterfronts. Money raised over the \$100,000 goal will be used to further enhance the waterfront program centers. Items such as new docks, program material and supplies, etc. So if you haven't pledged and are interested in contributing to our part of the campaign, please drop us a line at the Scout Office.

### BRUCE R. INGHAM

Bruce Ingham, Vice Chairman of the Yawgoog Alumni Association, is one of those volunteer leaders who has dedicated his Scouting life to keeping the "OUTING" in ScOUTING. With this year's expedition to the Maine High Adventure Area, Bruce will have completed his ninth trip as advisor on a Narragansett Council high adventure trip. Having brought crews to hike the mountains of Philmont in 1978 and 1979, this will be his seventh canoe/rafting trip on the rivers of northern Maine.



Bruce began his Scouting thirty-seven years ago as a Cub Scout in Pack 1 and then became a Boy Scout in Troop 1 Gaspee Plateau. After serving in all the usual Scout leadership positions, he became an Assistant Scoutmaster, and then the Scoutmaster of the troop in 1971. Under his leadership, Troop 1 became one of the best and most active troops in the Narragansett Council. Developing outstanding boy leaders became a trademark of his troop, producing dozens of excellent Yawgoog staff members during the 1970's and 1980's. Before "retiring" as Scoutmaster of Troop 1, Bruce received the West Shore District's Scoutmaster of the Year Award in 1977.

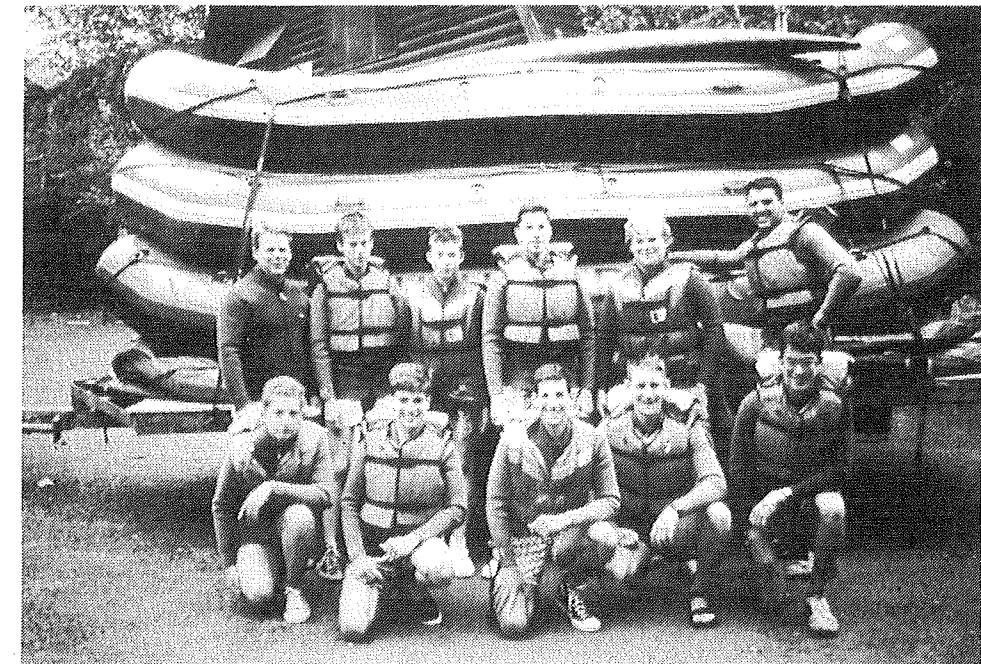
He was not out of Scouting for long, however, and after moving to East Greenwich, he became the Scoutmaster of Troop 18 Frenchtown from 1978 to 1983. As in Gaspee Plateau, his new troop became one of the best in the Council with an emphasis on developing a boy's Scouting skills through outdoor activities. Monthly camping, hiking and canoe trips were the rule. During Bruce's twelve years as a Scoutmaster, his two troops can boast of twenty-four Eagle Scouts and countless other outstanding young men who have gone on to successful careers and cheerful service to their communities. (Editor's note: The Secretary of the YAA, Chuck DeBevoise, was Bruce's FIRST Eagle Scout; the Treasurer of the YAA, Stephen Dolan, was his SEVENTH! Nice job, Bruce!!!)

Since 1983, Bruce has served the Council in several different capacities. As a member of the Council's Camping Committee, he served as the Program Sub-Committee Chairman from 1987 to 1989. From 1986 to 1993, Bruce was the Chairman of the High Adventure Committee, responsible for yearly summer expeditions to Philmont, Maine and Florida High Adventure Bases. It was because of this responsibility that he became the advisor for the Maine trips. When asked about these trips, he says, "There is no better test of leadership, maturity, or Scouting spirit than a high adventure experience. I wish EVERY Scout could go at least once!"

Bruce's association with Yawgoog began as a camper in 1961, and then as a staff member in 1966. During his twelve consecutive years on the staff, he served as a kitchen worker, commissioner, ASM and SM of provisional, Assistant Camp Director of Sandy Beach, and Camp Director of Three Point from 1975 to 1977. As a retired Yawgoog staff veteran, he joined the Executive Committee of the Yawgoog Alumni Association in 1986 and has been the Vice Chairman ever since.

In addition to his Scouting activities, Bruce is an active participant in his community as a member of the East Greenwich Animal Protection League. As part of his "Duty to God", he is on the Administrative Board and the Nominations Committee of the East Greenwich United Methodist Church where he also serves as one of the usher coordinators. He began his career as a Science teacher in the Warwick School Department in 1972 and is presently the Science Department Head at Gorton Junior High School.

The Scouts and leaders of the Narragansett Council and the Yawgoog Alumni owe a sincere "Thank You" to Bruce Ingham for his many years of dedicated service to Scouting and "helping other people at all times"!



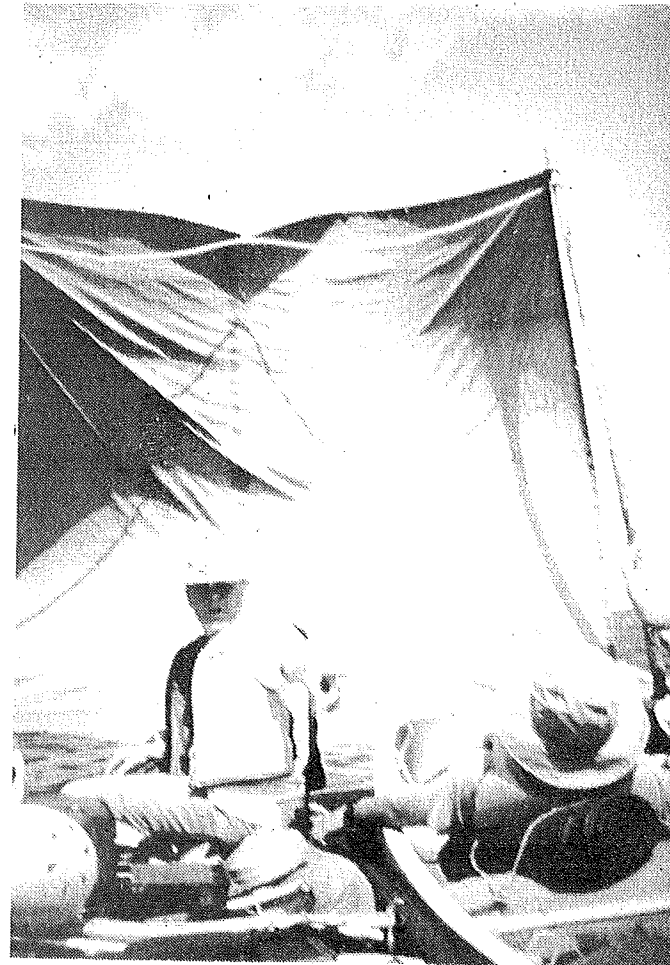
Bruce and the 1991 crew get ready for white-water rafting on the West Branch of the Penobscot River.

"PERSONALS"

STEVEN ADLER - (RI) 1977 - We are expecting our first child in the beginning of April, 1994. Very excited! (Congratulations, Mr. & Mrs. Adler!)

DAVID ATWOOD - DC - I received a very nice letter from Dave in January. Ordinarily I would not share an entire letter with all of you but Dave's letter explains the feelings and benefits of Scouting so well that I had to share it. It reads:

"This is the first letter I have ever written to you. And despite the address above, I am writing not from Washington (that's a diplomatic pouch mailing address) but from Bangladesh. After leaving Mali, West Africa, I was assigned here as a Foreign Service Officer with the US Agency for International Development. Actually I sought out this assignment because it is such a challenging and exciting place to work in my field, which is food and agricultural development. US tax dollars have had remarkable success here in making Bangladesh self sufficient in rice production, lowering the birth rate, providing light and electricity in remote villages, and in pulling millions of people out of poverty. But that is the subject of a different letter. In my spare time, both in Mali and now here in Bangladesh, I have started Cub Scout and Boy Scout groups affiliated with BSA. Preston Atwood, my dad, thought you would like to hear from me the same thoughts that I expressed to him about Scouting last year. I was a Scout in the 1960's. I went to Philmont in 1966, the World Scout Jamboree in 1967 (where I first heard of Hippies when we passed them -- in uniform -- in San Francisco on our way to the Idaho Jamboree sight). Much of what I know about camping and the outdoors comes from my Scouting experience. More important, I was a very shy boy lacking in confidence. Slowly, over a period of years, Scouting helped me develop confidence in myself, and confidence that I had something to offer other people. Of course, I will always have fond memories of Camp Yawgoog and of seeing you riding around waving to us there. I have many stories of Camp Yawgoog that my own children, one a Webelos and the other a Brownie, love to hear. It took me over two decades to reconstruct the importance of Scouting in my life though, because the sixties was such a confusing decade. By the end of the sixties, I was at Brown and probably never mentioned too much to anyone that I had been a Scout. In fact, it would have been an embarrassment. I went on to do many challenging outdoor and outdoor leadership activities (eg. Outward Bound, leading canoe and rock climbing at a boys camping Maine) which I was not embarrassed about but never took the time to realize that it was Scouting which had let me to such activities. If I thought about Scouting much at all over the years, it was to think that it was a rigid and militaristic organization (despite my own personal experience to the contrary!) Anyway, in Bamako, Mali, West Africa -- not too far from Timbuctou in fact -- there is not a lot for an American boy to do. So the year my son became Cub Scout age (in 1990) when the principle of the small

English language international school, together with some US Embassy folks, suggested that not only my son but others as well would benefit if I started a US Cub Scout Pack in Mali, I overcame my "revisionist" post-sixties feelings about Scouting and got things going. Boy did I have a great time, as did the boys. We played sports, changed whining and cheating into good sportsmanship, explored all around the hills surrounding the city of Bamko, made things, did teepees, hoisted large tires into trees, followed compass courses, camped in a dry riverbed, the whole bit. The boys had a great time, as did my co-leader who had never been a Scout. Suddenly I started remembering what a great time I myself had had as a Scout, forgetting the revisionist "militaristic" gloss I had imposed on my image of Scouting for two decades. Cub Scouts doubled in size to 13, the next year. The year after that we came here. The expatriate community here is much larger than in Mali, so when we started Cub Scouts at the American International School in Bangladesh last year, we had 39 boys, and now we have 66, counting Tiger Cubs. We have a tremendous pool of adult volunteers with a large number of skills. Now I don't do activities with the boys, except for five pack activities a year, but rather spend my time helping the Den leaders get organized. We have more den leaders here than the total number of Cub Scouts that I worked with in Mali. Our Cub Scout Pack represents about twenty-five different nationalities. We are planning a joint field day with a group of Bangladeshi Cub Scouts in a few weeks. While English is taught in the schools here, the level of English is not very good, so we have been trying to think of games that would get our Cub Scouts and the Bangladeshi Cubs working together without total mutual comprehension. Sure enough, I was able to draw on my own Scouting experience once more, remembering games that we played with Scouts who shared no common language at the 1967 World Scout Jamboree. Anyway, Gus, I wanted to let you know what I have been doing. This letter is my way of saying thanks to Scouting and to you for all you have done for so many boys over the years, and to let you know that the tradition continues. Best regards from Bangladesh, David Atwood." (I don't know about any of you, but this letter brought tears to my eyes. THIS is what Scouting is all about. Thank you, David, for sharing this with us. Gus)

HAL (HOWIE) BARR - MI 1969 - Doing well. Moved to Rochester Hills, MI. Have another baby due in February....that makes two. Saw Mike Schwab recently at 20th high school reunion. 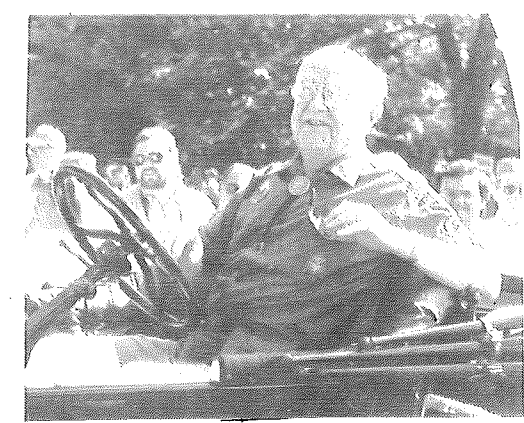
