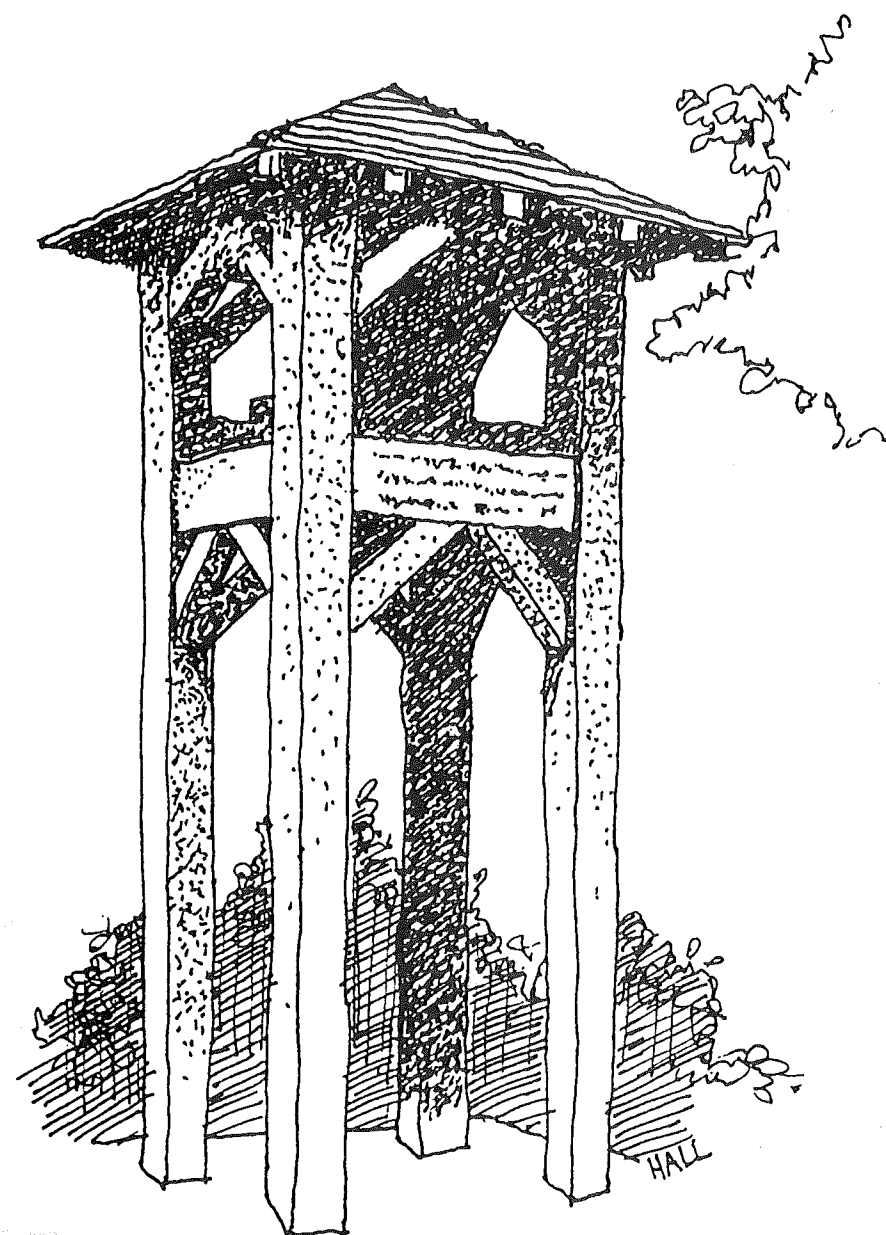

Thank you for helping to keep that "Yawgoog Spirit" alive through your active membership in the Alumni Association. This Association has grown over the past 17 years and we have given back to Yawgoog over one half million dollars in projects and investments!! Wow!! In 1995 we started the first phase of the Waterfront Projects and the Medicine Bow Waterfront was dedicated. In 1996 the Three Point Waterfront was completed, and we are proud to announce to our membership that the "Gigantic" two-story Sandy Beach Waterfront is ready for action for this summer! This magnificent waterfront facility will be opened for the troops camping week one, but the "formal" dedication ceremony is slated for the ALUMNI REUNION DAY which is **SATURDAY, AUGUST 2, 1997**. The Narragansett Council will be dedicating this Waterfront in honor of TOM and PAUL CHOQUETTE. Mark your calendar NOW and join us on August 2nd for our Annual Reunion and Dedication Ceremony. You will receive a separate mailing in June explaining the details. Don't miss it!

By the way, in case you forgot to pay your annual dues, you can still do so NOW. Just send it to the Scout Center and mark it attention to the Alumni Association. We sent out the annual dues/membership mailing last fall, but its never too late if it slipped your mind! Each member this year received the NEW Alumni Decal. The only way to get the decal is to become a member!! The membership dues is placed in a "restricted account" and only the interest money is used annually for Yawgoog projects. The Waterfront projects were funded through our Alumni portion of the Capital Campaign. Many, many thanks for all Alumni that made this drive such a success.

Besides the SB Waterfront this summer, the Alumni has also purchased all NEW Rifles at the Rifle Range, purchased \$1,000 of materials to spruce up the Indianlore program, funded 2 \$500 Alumni Staff Scholarships (and thanks to the generosity of two Alumni in our ranks we will add 2 additional \$500 scholarships bringing this year's total up to FOUR), refurbished photos, flags, and carpeting in the Memorial Room, and continued to expand the Alumni Heritage Museum. We have also started the complicated task of writing the third volume of the HISTORY OF YAWGOOG. This will be a one or two year project, and when it is completed we will publish it as we have previously done with volumes one and two.

I would like to thank the Alumni Executive Committee (names listed the the left) for the dedicated time and effort they have put into this organization all year long. I also hope you enjoy reading the BELLTOWER Newsletter. Hopefully it is keeping you up-to-date with what is happening at Yawgoog as well as letting you hear about what other Alumni are doing throughout the country. ## YAWGOOG TODAY

### "A PREVIEW OF YAWGOOG '97"

In just a few months Camp Yawgoog will once again come alive as Scouts participate in their best ever camping adventure. When you arrive it will become evident that much has been done to provide each Scout a "world class" facility and camping program. You'll marvel at the new Sandy Beach waterfront and cabin provided by our great Alumni Association. Three Point has new waterfront docks, the Temple of the Ten Commandments has received much needed improvements, there are several new picnic tables, and we have replaced nearly 50 dining hall benches. We continue to replace tents as needed and each year we purchase additional tent flies. The third increment of new kayaks will be ready for our Scouts at Ashaway and we will have the second increment of new rowboats. The Sandy Beach dining hall roof has new shingles.

We continue to fine tune our program and have hired additional waterfront counselors to conduct the CPR training required for each of the waterfront merit badges. Mountain biking has been moved to the Fuller Cabin at Curtis Tract which will remove the bike traffic from Donald North Court and Camp Yawgoog Road. Adjustments have been made to the merit badge schedule as we strive to give each Scout the best learning experience possible. Shotgun Shooting merit badge is a new offering for the 1997 season. A recycling program called "ALUMINUM CANS FOR CHALLENGE" is being initiated to raise funds for our proposed new COPE course to be built during the Fall of 1997. We'll need plenty of help in making this project work and more information will be provided during Scoutmaster meetings in the Spring.

The key staff is in place and ready to deliver the program to our Scouts. At Three Point the Camp Director is Pat McCue. Medicine Bow will be led by Alan MacDonald, and our Sandy Beach Director is Marc Ryan. Marc Cardin is taking on the responsibilities of the Director of Food Services, Jackie Hawes is our Trading Post Director and Andrew Daniels returns for his second year as Trading Post Manager. Greig Pelleccione is the Director of Camps and Programs. Zane Mahar is the Reservation Business Manager. Doctor Bernard Marzilli, Jr. returns as the Reservation Medical Director. Our Chaplains include Father Paul Desmarais, Father Richard Morgan, and Chaplain Rina Wolfgang. Mike McGrath has agreed to serve as the Eagle Camp Director. Paul Forbes is our Reservation Superintendent and Rich Greene returns as the Reservation Director. Each member of the key staff is ready to make this, the 82nd camping season at our favorite camping place, the "best ever" for all who come through T. Dawson Brown Gate.

Chief Yawgoog has rested well and his spirit is renewed. Come experience Scouting at its best and it is certain that you will catch the "Spirit of Yawgoog." See you soon as we together join in the adventure that is only possible at YAWGOOG.

## RANGERS REPORT

Have you ever wondered what goes on at Yawgoog after the last summer campers leave in late August? Well, rest assured Yawgoog is a busy place all year long. In fact, during the "off season" months upwards of 5,000 campers use the facilities which include six rental cabins as well as outdoor sites. A dedicated crew of volunteers form the Campmaster Corps, which help provide program opportunities to the troops. They are able to open the Rifle Range and offer a Trading Post as well as assist the units with program needs.

In addition to the traditional Boy Scout troop activities, the BSA sponsored Learning for Life program makes use of the low C.O.P.E. elements as well as hiking and compass course opportunities. These groups are typically from elementary schools throughout the state and come to camp during the week as part of their school day.

A year 'round crew of four makes up the Ranger staff. This group is responsible for all of the maintenance of the buildings and property as well as the security of the camp. Typical projects during the winter months include building bunks, dining tables, benches, picnic tables, bulletin boards, tent platforms and rails. Maintenance of vehicles is also included in the job.

This winter found us building the dining hall tables and benches, picnic tables and other items for the brand new Feinstein Youth Camp for Cub Scouts at Buck Hill. We will be closely involved in the final preparations, painting and cleanup in the late spring.

When the weather breaks in the spring it is time to ready the grounds for the upcoming summer. All fields are limed and fertilized. When the grass is growing it takes the equivalent hours of one man working four days straight to keep it all in check. Campsites and program areas must be patrolled for winter storm damage and all dangerous trees and limbs are dealt with. Wood chips are hauled into areas and spread to help ease the effects of compaction and erosion of the soil. This is the time of year when we plant new Christmas trees and care for the existing trees by fertilizing and pruning.

The water system must be brought on line and sanitized to state specifications. All of the pipes and lines feeding the various sites and buildings must be connected and sanitized (almost 2 miles of it). The state requires that the water system be operated and maintained by certified operators which results in three of the Rangers maintaining licenses issued by the state. In order to keep these licenses current, ongoing training is required. All of this insures that the camp is supplied with water of the highest quality, meeting all Federal and State guidelines.

With the arrival of Spring, comes a variety of special events. Wood Badge training, White Stag training, and Cub Scout Adventure Weekends are all held at Yawgoog in the months of May and June. The setup for this involves the work of many including adult volunteers, Yawgoog staff, and the members of the executive board of the Yawgoog Alumni Association.

So, as you can see, the Yawgoog Spirit continues to be alive and well long after the last summer campers have left. The gate is always open to all Alumni members, so stop in and take a look at your favorite camp in the off season. We'll be glad to show you "what's new".

## CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

The Yawgoog Alumni Association's five year Capital Campaign to raise \$100,000 to meet its pledge to the Narragansett Council's Capital Campaign is in its fourth year. As of March 12, 1997, a total of \$124,745 has been pledged to the Campaign and \$82,361 of cash payments have been received. The Medicine Bow Waterfront Cabin was rebuilt at a cost of \$42,000 and presented to the Camp at the Reunion in 1995. The Three Point Waterfront Cabin was rebuilt at a cost of \$28,000 and presented to the Camp at the Reunion in 1996. Reconstruction of the Sandy Beach Waterfront Cabin is now underway and is estimated to cost \$40,000. The Cabin will be officially presented to Camp during a special dedication ceremony at the Reunion this summer on Saturday, August 2, 1997. Hopefully you will be present for this memorable event. The status of the reconstruction of the Sandy Beach Waterfront Cabin is reported in more detail elsewhere in this newsletter by Mike Schwab, our Chairman of the Building and Planning Subcommittee.

The Narragansett Council plans to spend \$2,294,000 of Capital Campaign money on improvements at Camp Yawgoog. To date, the Council has spent about \$1,950,000 at Camp on projects that include refurbishments of the Bucklin Memorial buildings, the three camp dining halls and kitchens, the warehouse facilities, and the family cabins, road resurfacing, construction of composting latrines, dam repair, and purchases of tents, flies, and other program equipment. To all of you who have made and will be making pledge payments, the Executive Committee says "thank you" for your continued support of Camp Yawgoog.

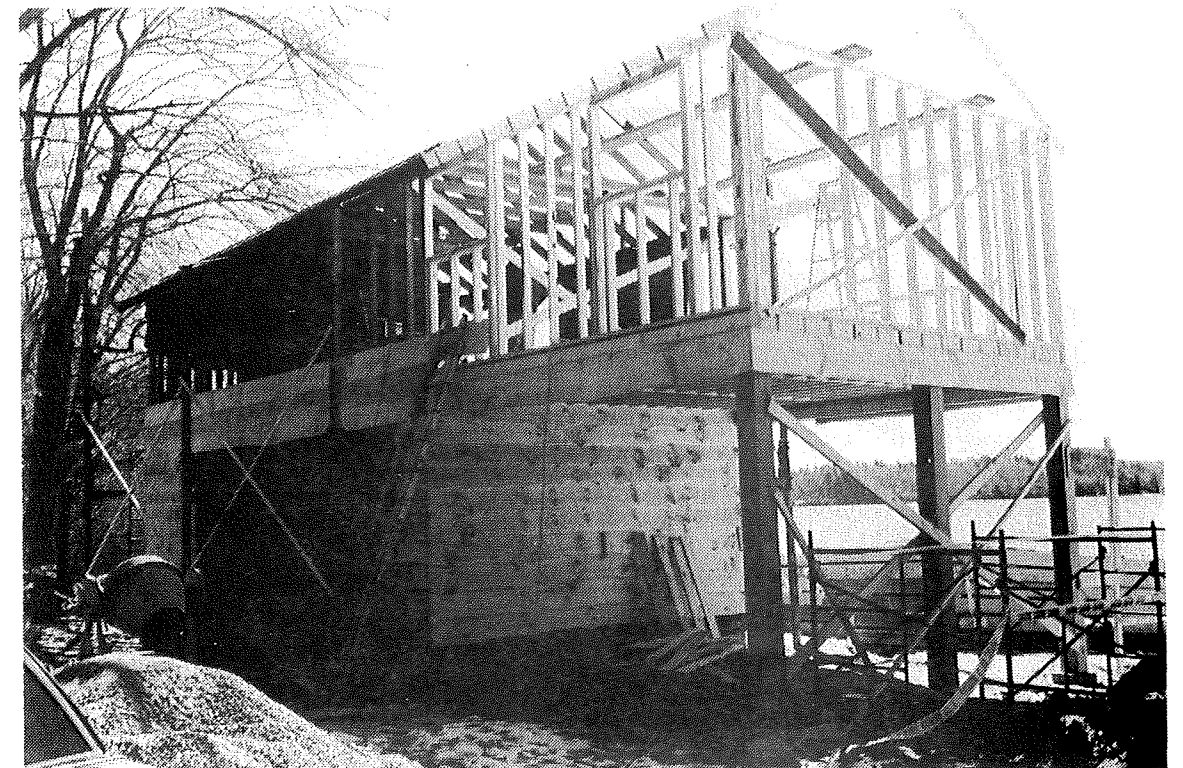
## CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

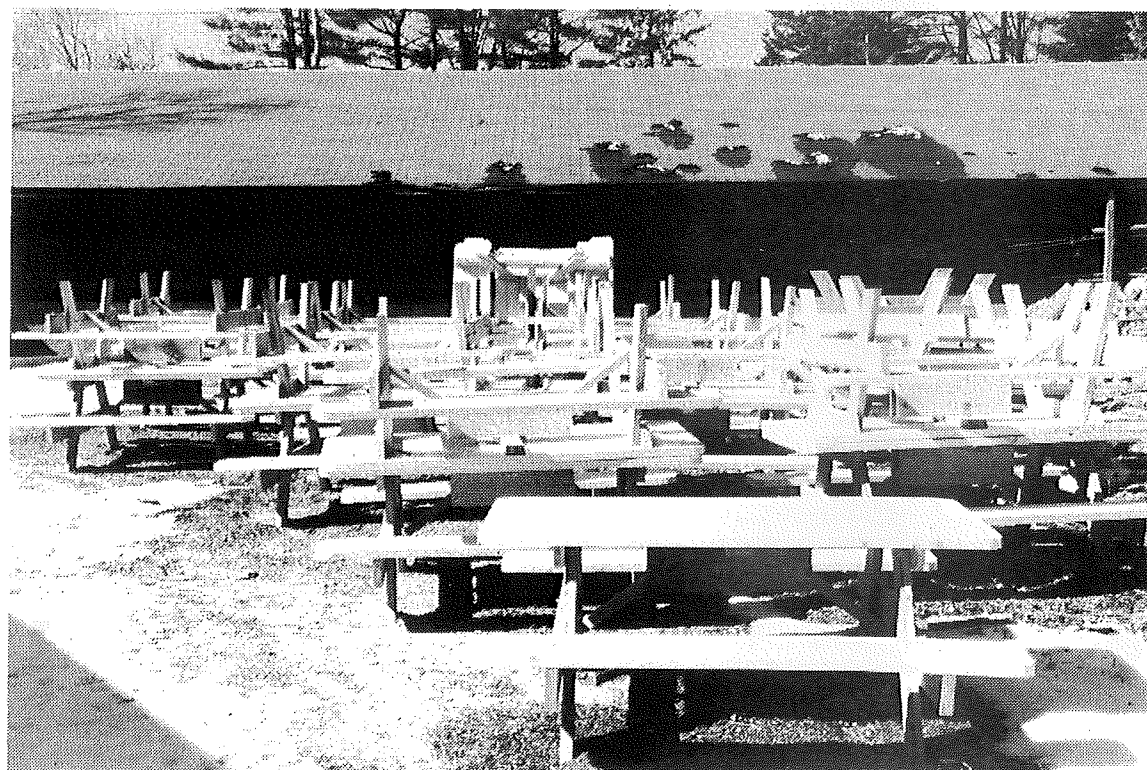

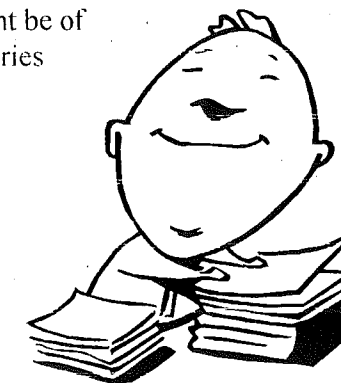
