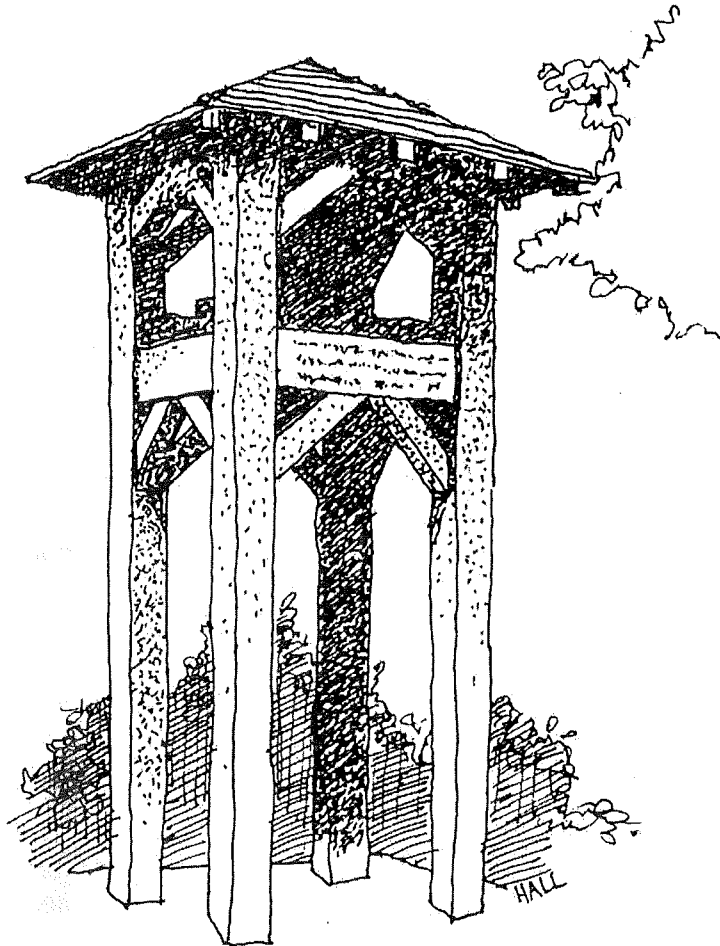

GUS'S GOSSIP

Eagle Scout, Stan Leibo (New Orleans, LA) attended Yawgoog for the first time with Troop 20 Providence in 1949. He spent his first and second summers at Yawgoog in Sandy Beach Veterans campsite. Midway through the season of his third summer, he was appointed as a Health Lodge Orderly. When he returned to Yawgoog in 1952, his new position was Assistant in Medicine Bow Trading Post under the direction of Bruce Fogel. In 1953, he served as Assistant in the Headquarters Trading Post working for Roger Paulson and graduated the next year to Co-Head of Headquarters Trading Post with Alden Blackman. For the next four years – until 1958 – Stan served as a Commissary Assistant and Trading Post co-director working with Bob Critchell, Alden Blackman and Bart Nourse.

Since 1998, Stan has been living in New Orleans and teaches full-time at the University of New Orleans, giving lectures in two courses each semester. He teaches Introductory Biology, Reproductive Biology, Developmental Biology and Cell Biology. He continues doing collaborative research with colleagues at the University of Tennessee, the University of Guelph in Canada, and at a research center in Tokyo. This past October, he taught a course in Gamete Cryopreservation at a research institute in Italy....and has been doing that each year since 1999. Stan also taught the same course at Jackson Laboratory in Bar Harbor, Maine, since 1988. In November, he went to Tokyo to present a lecture at a scientific symposium.

Wow, Stan, very impressive career!! I'm sure your experiences at Yawgoog prepared you well for your life's work! Judy

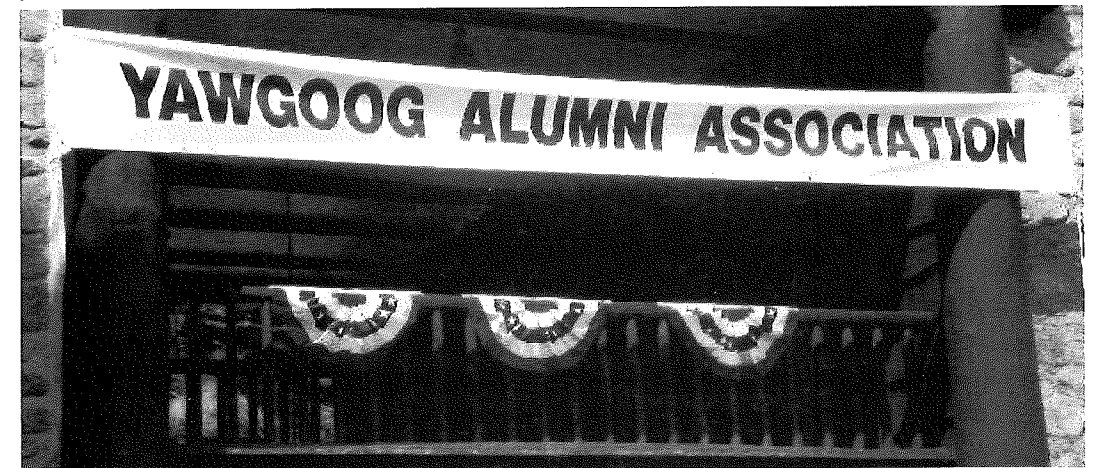

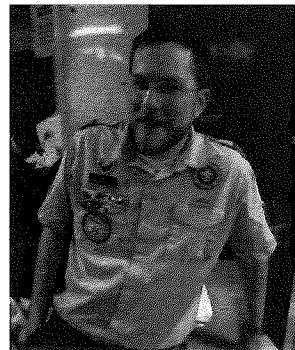
Dear Alumni,

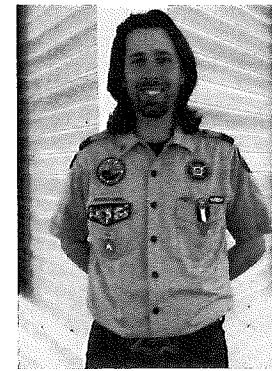

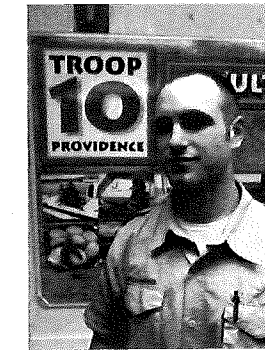
Mike Hogan - Assistant Reservation Director

Camp Director

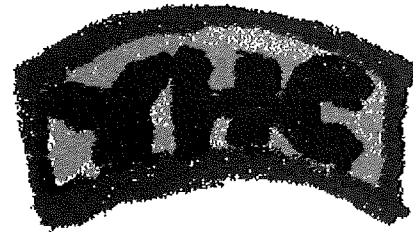

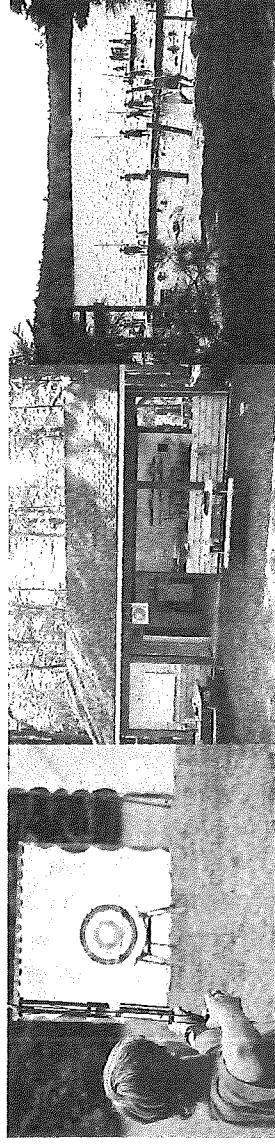

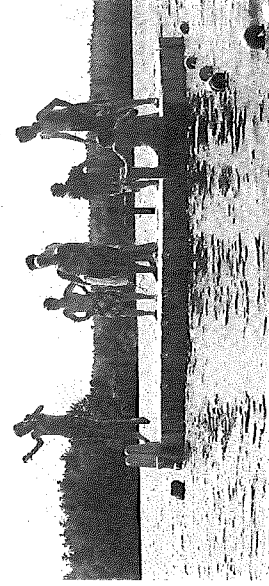
